Music at the Basilica

Music for the Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

This week we will hear music by the Spanish Renaissance composer Francisco de Peñalosa (1470-1528). He was born in Talavera de la Reina in the province of Toledo. He spent most of his career in Seville, serving as the maestro di capilla, though he also spent time in Burgos, and three or more years in Rome at the papal chapel (1518-1521). Peñalosa was the most famous Spanish composer of the generation before Cristóbal de Morales, and his compositions were highly regarded.



Why have you never heard of him? Well, mostly it is a matter of technology. Unfortunately for him, he did not benefit from the invention of printing, since he mostly remained in Spain, away from cities such as Venice and Antwerp which were the first centers of printed music. Peñalosa was evidently fond of contrapuntal puzzles and canons (like some of his Franco-Flemish models); for instance, the Agnus Dei of his Missa Ave Maria peregrina, which combines a plainsong tune with a retrograde (backwards) version of a famous secular song by Hayne van Ghizeghem. As Spain conquered the Americas, this sophisticated music was being written in their courts. The Ave verum is elegantly simple, and shows complete compositional mastery of what one might consider an older form of music. Enjoy it and dream of Spain.

RESTORATION UPDATE

ALL SUNDAY MASSES WILL BE CELEBRATED in the YOUTH CENTER AT 268 MULBERRY ST. (just south of Houston Street)

OCTOBER 25
NOVEMBER 1**

The temporary partition that divided the nave is now completely removed. Progress is being made in laying down travertine stone. The pews have been refurbished and ready to be re-installed. The application of the "prime paint" is underway on the walls and ceiling.

Probably the most dramatic news is the installation of the large Rose Window on the east side of the church facing Mulberry Street. It is the oldest stained glass in the church having been originally installed in 1867. All the other stained glass windows will follow over the next three months.

RESTORATION UPDATE (continued)

The architects and liturgical designers are using images from the 19th century as a guide to restore the church. The original colors of the walls and ceiling have been discovered under several years of paint. The old wood pews are been cleaned refined. In addition:

- The Tabernacle returns to its original location in the center of the sanctuary;
- A new *Altagracia Chapel* will provide a location for daily Mass;
- A restored crucifix suspended from the ceiling over the altar;
- The design of the original communion rail (removed in 1970) will be used for a new railing near the baptismal font;
- *Memorial of Archbishop John Hughes* to be located in the front courtyard.
- The original colors statue of the saints in the sanctuary have been restored;
- An elevator will be installed allowing the mobility impaired to go down to the Catacombs as well as up to the sanctuary level;
- A ramp will provide access for the mobility impaired from the Mott Street courtyard;
- A new glass partition will separate the nave from the Gathering Area in the back of the church;
- Refurbished confessionals with padded kneelers;
- A new heating and air-conditioning system;
- A "chancel organ" in addition to the Erben organ in the choir loft;
- Restored chandeliers in addition to a new lighting system;
- A renovated catacombs.

TRADITION PRESERVATION CAMPAIGN

Benefactors will be sought for many of the restored sacred objects in the church, including the Cross above the Altar, the Tabernacle, the Stations of the Cross and Resurrection painting by Frank Mason.

Plaques - The existing plaques on pews and other places within the church will be respected and restored. The pews are due back into the church in September.

WELCOME, SENIORS! Our Project Manager, Bill Russo, has come up with an idea for a luncheon for our seniors. Monsignor Sakano and the rest of the staff agree this is a wonderful idea. SAN VINCENZO di MARTIRE: We would like to remind you of the upcoming Feast of San Vincenzo. As was the case with the San Rocco Feast this past August, this will be the first time the Craco Society will hold its annual Mass in honor of San Vincenzo here at the Shrine Church of the Most Precious Blood. The San Vincenzo Mass will be held at 10:00 am on October 25th; as of this writing, the Mass will be celebrated by Father Nicholas Grieco.

BEATO ANGELO SOCIETY: Also being celebrated on this Sunday, October 25, is the annual Mass of the Beato Angelo Society. In contrast to the two new additions mentioned above, the Beato Angelo Society has been celebrating their annual Mass here for over 50 years. The Mass this year will once again be celebrated by our former pastor, Father Fabian Grifone, OFM. Father Fabian has celebrated this Mass for the past 22 years. Beato Angelo is translated as "Blessed Angelo". He was born in 1669 in Acri, Calabria, Italy. He would come to be known as the great apostle of Southern Italy. He entered the Capuchin Order and was a missionary for 40 years until his death in 1739.
