## Music at the Basilica

### Music for the Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time



The postlude last week was the first movement of Alexandre Guilmant's famous Organ Sonata number 2. This week, I follow it up with the second movement, a Larghetto, from the same work. This is Guilmant's own arrangement for harmonium, or reed organ. The reed organ was once an important domestic instrument, offering a cheap alternative to the ever-popular family piano while at the same time providing a suitable instrument for accompanying family hymns on a Sunday. It was the product of a world-wide industry which turned out hundreds of thousands of organs a year at its peak. Reed organs are today the province of collectors and museums, often desired for their often impressively tall and embellished cases. They operate with air, but in a different way from a true pipe organ. A suction bellows draws air out from within the action of the organ. When a note is played by depressing a key, air is sucked into the action through a small chamber containing a free reed. The passing air causes the reed to vibrate, producing a tone. Stops are used to control which sets of reeds are to be employed for playing. The organ postlude is by Johann Pachelbel, more famous for his Canon in D than anything else; he wrote much music for the Church (Pachelbel spent five years in Catholic, imperial Vienna and worked in St. Stephen's Cathedral, absorbing the music of Catholic composers from southern Germany and Italy), but today we hear a fugue—usually this time of year I pull out the Bach Toccata and Fugue, but alas, that will have to wait until the church is finished! The Bachs and Pachelbel were well known to each other; one of the Bachs was his landlord, another Bach was his student.

## RESTORATION UPDATE

### ALL SUNDAY MASSES WILL BE CELEBRATED in the YOUTH CENTER AT 268 MULBERRY ST. (just south of Houston Street) NOVEMBER 1

The temporary partition that divided the nave is now completely removed. Progress is being made in laying down travertine stone. The pews have been refurbished and ready to be re-installed. The application of the "prime paint" is underway on the walls and ceiling.

Probably the most dramatic news is the installation of the large Rose Window on the east side of the church facing Mulberry Street. It is the oldest stained glass in the church having been originally installed in 1867. All the other stained glass windows will follow over the next three months.

The installation of the Memorial to Archbishop John Hughes in the courtyard will occur on 11-14.

## RESTORATION UPDATE (continued)

The architects and liturgical designers are using images from the 19th century as a guide to restore the church. The original colors of the walls and ceiling have been discovered under several years of paint. The old wood pews are being cleaned and refined. In addition:

- The Tabernacle returns to its original location in the center of the sanctuary;
- A new *Altagracia Chapel* will provide a location for daily Mass;
- A restored crucifix suspended from the ceiling over the altar;
- The design of the original communion rail (removed in 1970) will be used for a new railing near the baptismal font;
- *Memorial of Archbishop John Hughes* to be located in the front courtyard.
- The original colors statue of the saints in the sanctuary have been restored;
- An elevator will be installed allowing the mobility impaired to go down to the Catacombs as well as up to the sanctuary level;
- A ramp will provide access for the mobility impaired from the Mott Street courtyard;
- A new glass partition will separate the nave from the Gathering Area in the back of the church;
- Refurbished confessionals with padded kneelers;
- A new heating and air-conditioning system;
- A "chancel organ" in addition to the Erben organ in the choir loft;
- Restored chandeliers in addition to a new lighting system;
- A renovated catacombs.

## TRADITION PRESERVATION CAMPAIGN

**Benefactors** will be sought for many of the restored sacred objects in the church, including the Cross above the Altar, the Tabernacle, the Stations of the Cross and Resurrection painting by Frank Mason.

**Plaques** - The existing plaques on pews and other places within the church will be respected and restored. The pews are due back into the church in September.

**The Feast of Beato Angelo d' Acri** will also be celebrated on Sunday, October 25. Mass is at 12 noon. Beato Angelo d'Acri (Blessed Anthony of Acri, Italy) is a special person to the people of Acri and worthy of respect and honor by all people everywhere.
