Music at the Basilica



Music for the Thirty-Second Week of Ordinary Time

The composer of the prelude this week, Josef Rheinberger (1839-1901), was a great German organist, composer, and pedagogue. He has a particular relationship to the Basilica of St. Patrick's Old Cathedral. A little background: at the age of seven, he became organist of Vaduz parish church, and performed his first composition a year later. In 1851, he entered the Munich Conservatory. By 1877, Rheinberger obtained the rank of court conductor, a position that gave him responsibility for the music in the royal chapel. When the present Munich Conservatory was founded, Rheinberger was appointed its professor of organ and composition, a post he held until his death. Rheinberger's influences ranged from contemporaries such as Johannes Brahms, as well as to Franz Schubert and Johann Sebastian Bach.

Rheinberger was a talented teacher, counting many Americans among his pupils, including Horatio Parker, William Berwald, George Whitefield Chadwick, Bruno Klein, and Henry Holden Huss; the Italian composer Ermanno Wolf-Ferrari; Germans Engelbert Humperdinck and Wilhelm Furtwängler (one of the greatest conductors of all time); and the British-born John White, Organist and Conductor of the Cathedral from c. 1875 through 1882. White was a student of Rheinberger in Munich, and had a very successful career in the states, later becoming the organist at the tony Church of the Ascension on 5th Avenue. By 1892, he had an address at the Dakota on Central Park West, and returned to Munich in 1896.

JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY

Last April Pope Francis announced to the world that an Extraordinary Jubilee Holy Year of Mercy would begin on December 8 with the opening of Holy Doors at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. In addition, the Pope asked other cathedrals and basilicas around the world to participate by having their own Holy Doors.

The Basilica of St. Patrick's Old Cathedral is honored, with the blessing of Cardinal Dolan, to have Holy Doors at its sister church, the Shrine Church of the Most Precious Blood for the duration of the Holy Year. With these Holy Doors open 24hrs a day, pilgrims passing through them will benefit from indulgences and blessings. Pilgrims will reflect on the major theme of the Holy Year – *the universal reach of God's mercy* – by viewing a display of *presepio*, crafted in Naples, Italy by La Scarabattola. The *presepio* will be blessed in the Church of the Most Precious Blood in New York City on Tuesday, December 8. The Holy Doors will be opened there on Sunday, December 13 as we have been asked to do by Pope Francis.

The temporary partition that divided the nave is now completely removed. Progress is being made in laying down travertine stone. The pews have been refurbished and ready to be re-installed. The application of the "prime paint" is underway on the walls and ceiling.

Probably the most dramatic news is the installation of the large Rose Window on the east side of the church facing Mulberry Street. It is the oldest stained glass in the church having been originally installed in 1867. All the other stained glass windows will follow over the next three months.

The installation of the Memorial to Archbishop John Hughes in the courtyard will occur on 11-14.
