MUSIC AT THE BASILICA

Lent III

From the very beginnings of the study of music history and musicology, Josquin has been considered the leading Renaissance composer of the 15th century. He spent most of his musical life in Italy; for fifteen years in the Milan Cathedral, then in the private chapel of Maria Sforza, and then a member of the Sistine choir from 1486-1499, after which he went to Milan and Ferrara. The exquisite piece we hear today at Communion is the second part of a larger motet (Magnus es tu Domine). The anonymous Latin devotional text is particularly beautiful, and the music gives it full effect. Here it is in Latin and English:

*Tu pauperum refugium, tu languorum remedium,
spes exsulum, fortitudo laborantium,
via errantium, veritas et vita.
Et nunc Redemptor, Domine, ad te solum confugio;
te verum Deum adoro, in te spero,
in te confido, salus mea, Jesu Christe.
Adjuva me, ne unquam obdormiat in morte anima mea.*

Thou art the refuge of the poor, remedy for afflictions,
hope of exiles, strength of those who labor,
way for the wandering, truth and life.
And now, Redeemer, Lord, in thee alone I take refuge;
thee, true God, I adore, in thee I hope,
in thee I confide, my salvation, O Jesus Christ.
Help me, lest my soul ever sleep in death.

This would be an ideal motet for this year of mercy too. Josquin's one hundred motets convey the emotional and intellectual meanings of the texts, though not overtly, as we hear in the late Renaissance and early Baroque periods. Note the change to triple time as the words turn to Jesus directly, culminating in the rejoicing of the upper voices and lower voices at the end. It is a piece that inspires awe and mystery, like the burning bush; it exemplifies the relationship between God and man, creator and creature.

At Offertory, we hear a piece by the Venetian Baroque composer and magistrate Benedetto Marcello, whose brother, Alessandro Marcello, was also a well-known composer. A contemporary of Vivaldi, Marcello is best remembered for his *Estro poetico-armonico*, a musical setting of the first 50 Psalms for voices, continuo, and occasional solo instruments.

HOLY DOORS OF MERCY

The Basilica of St. Patrick's Old Cathedral is honored, with the blessing of Cardinal Dolan, to have HOLY DOORS at its sister church, the Shrine Church of the Most Precious Blood for the duration of the Holy Year. With these Holy Doors open 24hrs a day, pilgrims passing through them will benefit from indulgences and blessings. Pilgrims will reflect on the major theme of the Holy Year – *the universal reach of God's mercy* – by viewing a display of *presepio*, crafted in this city of Naples by La Scarabattola.

For those in a state of grace and fulfilling the other prescribed conditions, a *plenary indulgence* may be gained once day by passing through the Holy Doors. A plenary indulgence removes all punishment due to sin.

Those seeking the indulgence are encouraged to begin a pilgrimage starting at the Basilica of St. Patrick's Old Cathedral where a Prayer of Mercy may be said. The pilgrim then may proceed down to the Shrine Church of the Most Precious Blood where the Holy Doors of Mercy are located.
