## MUSIC AT THE BASILICA

### Music for the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time



William Boyce (1711-1779) was a well-known English composer and organist, who started his training in St. Paul's Cathedral (London) as a choirboy. His first professional appointment came in 1734 when he was employed as an organist at the Oxford Chapel, and he went on to take a number of similar posts before being appointed Master of the King's Musick in 1755 and one of the organists at the Chapel Royal in 1758. One of his students was the prodigy Thomas Linley, who was known as the English Mozart (the two were friends, meeting in Florence in 1770 at the age of 14). He is well-known for his sacred pieces, as well as his eight symphonies, which orchestras are playing again in concert halls after a period of neglect.

The much-admired French composer and organist Jehan Alain (1911-1940) was trained in counterpoint, fugue, and improvisation by all the luminaries of the Paris Conservatoire, but he also was influenced by jazz and musical traditions from around the world. The motet we hear today at Communion was composed for the inauguration of the restored organ of the Basilica of St. Ferjeux in Besançon, where the Alain family gave "spiritual concerts." He died as a soldier in World War II: a skilled motorcyclist, he came around a curve, and hearing the approaching tread of the Germans, abandoned his motorcycle and engaged the enemy troops with his carbine, killing 16 of them before being killed himself. He was posthumously awarded the Croix de Guerre for his bravery.

The postlude this week is the famous Toccata and Fugue BWV 565 by J. S. Bach; despite its continued use in popular media, and history of adaption for film and popular culture, it retains a joyous nobility.

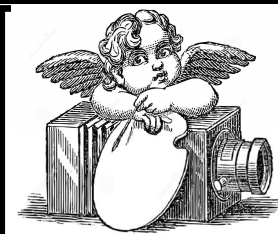

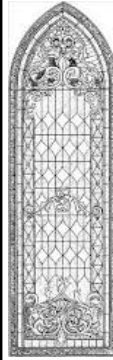

## Stained Glass Windows

The remaining stained glass windows will be installed during November. Keep in mind, that the restoration of the windows is a monumental effort since that tracery section of the windows (the woodwork that frames the stained glass) had to be hand hewn from hard wood. The old frames and tracery were so deteriorated that they no longer could safely hold the glass in place. The remaining stained glass windows will be completed by December 1.

The stained glass that you now see is the same glass that was there before the restoration. The glass looks new because each piece was cleaned and in some cases replaced where there were breaks or pieces missing.

**BEATO ANGELO OF ACRI:** Sunday, October 30, 2016 (tomorrow) the Beato Angelo Society will hold its annual Mass in honor of their beloved saint. The Mass begins at 12:00 Noon. Beato Angelo of Acri was a Capuchin born October 19, 1669 and died October 30, 1739. He was born Lucantonio Falcone, son of Francesco Falcone and Diana Enrico, people of humble origins. Acri is a town in the province of Cosenza in the Calabria region of Italy. Beato “Blessed” Angelo was known as the “Angel of Peace” and, until his death in 1739, performed numerous miracles. His body was beatified by Pope Leo XII in 1825. Please join the members of the Beato Angelo Society tomorrow, Sunday, October 30th at 12:00 Noon for this annual devotion to their great saint. All are welcome to attend.
