Music at the Basilica

Music for the Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Firstly, a special note of thanks to the schola members who participated in the Sacred Liturgy conference last week. It was an incredible amount of music to learn, but it was greatly appreciated by the conference attendees. I hope by experiencing Mass and Vespers in the extraordinary form you come to understand better the structure of the Novus Ordo.



Allein Gott in der Höh' (All glory be to God on high) is the Offertory hymn this week, based on the Gregorian chant Gloria. Last week, we heard a set of variations by Bach on the hymn O Gott du Frommer Gott; this week we hear a model for that piece by the great Dutch composer and organist Jans Pieterzoon Sweelinck (1562-1621). Sweelinck is a pivotal figure, bridging the Renaissance and Baroque periods. His brother went to Venice, and the influence of the Gabriellis can be seen in his compositions. He was taught by the Catholic pastor of the Oude Kerk in Amsterdam, as well as his father and grandfather in music (also being organists). These lessons stopped in 1578 after the Reformation in Amsterdam, but remained in his position in the Oude Kerk from 1580 on, despite the lack of organ in reformed liturgy. He improvised on psalms before and after liturgy, and played for state and secular occasions. Sweelinck represents a pinnacle in keyboard contrapuntal complexity and refinement before J.S. Bach. He was a master improviser and teacher, whose pupils founded the North German organ school.

The temporary partition that divided the nave is now completely removed. Progress is being made in laying down travertine stone. The pews have been refurbished and ready to be re-installed. The application of the "prime paint" is underway on the walls and ceiling.

Probably the most dramatic news is the installation of the large Rose Window on the east side of the church facing Mulberry Street. It is the oldest stained glass in the church having been originally installed in 1867. All the other stained glass windows will follow over the next three month.

RESTORATION UPDATE (continued)

The architects and liturgical designers are using images from the 19th century as a guide to restore the church. The original colors of the walls and ceiling have been discovered under several years of paint. The old wood pews are been cleaned refined. In addition:

- The Tabernacle returns to its original location in the center of the sanctuary;
- A new *Altagracia Chapel* will provide a location for daily Mass;
- A restored crucifix suspended from the ceiling over the altar;
- The design of the original communion rail (removed in 1970) ne used for a new railing near the baptismal font.;
- *Memorial of Archbishop John Hughes* to be located in the front courtyard.
- The original colors statue of the saints in the sanctuary have been restored;
- An elevator will be installed allowing the mobility impaired to go down to the Catacombs as well as up to the sanctuary level;
- A ramp will provide access for the mobility impaired from the Mott Street courtyard;
- A new glass partition will separate the nave from the Gathering Area in the back of the church;
- Refurbished confessionals with padded kneelers;
- A new heating and air-conditioning system;
- A "chancel organ" in addition to the Erben organ in the choir loft;
- Restored chandeliers in addition to a new lighting system;
- A renovated catacombs.

TRADITION PRESERVATION CAMPAIGN

Benefactors will be sought for many of the restored sacred objects in the church, including the Cross above the Altar, the Tabernacle, the Stations of the Cross and Resurrection painting by Frank Mason.

Plaques - The existing plaques on pews and other places within the church will be respected and restored. The pews are due back into he church in September.

BULLETIN NEWS

COLUMBUS DAY: Monday, October 12th is Columbus Day, a national holiday. Consequently, the rectory office will be closed and there are **NO scheduled Masses.**

BLESSING OF ANIMALS: Sunday, October 11th is the day when you can bring your animals to the Basilica of St. Patrick's Old Cathedral. After the 12:45 PM Mass, approximately 1:45 PM to 2:45 PM, animals will be blessed in the courtyard on Mott Street between Prince & Houston Streets, weather permitting. **For those of you who picked up the flyer last week, PLEASE**

NOTE: The correct date is October 11 – NOT October 13th. You will need to make an appointment if you have a particularly ferocious or poisonous animal.

SAN VINCENZO di MARTIRE: We would like to remind you of the upcoming Feast of San Vincenzo. As was the case with the San Rocco Feast this past August, this will be the first time the Craco Society will hold its annual Mass in honor of San Vincenzo here at the Shrine Church of the Most Precious Blood. Many of you are aware that the closing of St. Joseph's Church is what brought these societies and the celebrations of their respective saints to this church. **The San Vincenzo Mass will be held at 10:00 am on October 25th; as of this writing, the Mass will be celebrated by Father Nicholas Grieco.**

BEATO ANGELO SOCIETY: Also being celebrated on this Sunday, October 25, is the annual Mass of the Beato Angelo Society. In contrast to the two new additions mentioned above, the Beato Angelo Society has been celebrating their annual Mass here for over 50 years. The Mass this year will once again be celebrated by our former pastor, Father Fabian Grifone, OFM, as he has done for the past 22 years. Beato Angelo is translated as "Blessed Angelo". He was born in 1669 in Acri, Calabria, Italy. He would come to be known as the great apostle of Southern Italy. He entered the Capuchin Order and was a missionary for 40 years until his death in 1739.

ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE: The new semester has begun for ESL classes, sponsored by the Vietnam Learning Arts & Culture Center (VLACC).
