MUSIC AT THE BASILICA

Music for the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time

On the third week of each month, at the 12:45 PM Mass, we sing a choral Kyrie and Agnus Dei. There is a vast repertoire of polyphonic Masses, and this is our opportunity to use these parts of them in our worship. This week we sing the Missa l' hora passa by Viadana. Lodovico Grossi da Viadana was born in Viadana, a town in the province of Mantua, Italy in 1560. Viadana composed sacred music (mostly) and bridged the Renaissance and Baroque periods of music with jewel-like masses, psalms, magnificats, motets, and lamentations. He is sometimes credited with the invention of figured bass, a way of notating harmony in the technique known as basso continuo that had its flowering in the baroque era. This particular Mass is compact, and fits the Basilica's acoustics well. Though often performed a capella, it was likely accompanied in most churches.



Another piece of music we will sing is part of the Canticle of Zechariah set by Diego Ortiz (c. 1510—1570), a Spanish composer and theorist in service to the Spanish viceroy of Naples, and later to Philip II of Spain. The text (Luke 1:68-79) is known better by its Latin name, Benedictus, and one of the three canticles in the opening chapters of this Gospel (the other two being the Magnificat and the Nunc dimittis). The Benedictus was the song of thanksgiving uttered by Zechariah on the occasion of the circumcision of his son, John the Baptist, and introduced to Lauds (perhaps) by Benedict of Nursia in the early 6th century. The music comes from a collection of polyphonic religious music published in 1565 in Venice: *Musices liber primus hymnos, Magnificas, Salves, motecta, psalmos*, which includes sixty-nine compositions for four to seven voices, based on plainchant works. They are stylistically conservative for the period, appropriate to the tastes of the dedicatee, Ortiz's employer, Pedro Afán de Rivera, the Spanish Viceroy in Naples, who appointed him maestro of the Chapel Royal of Naples. In the preface to this publication, Ortiz encourages performers to accompany these sacred polyphonic works with instruments, a practice favored at the time in Spain, and promises future publication of a book of Masses, which never appeared.

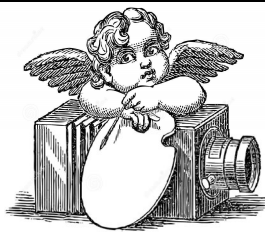
